CARE Ratings Nepal Limited (CRNL) has been seeking information from Himalayan Power Partner Limited (HPPL) to monitor the ratings vide e-mail communications/ letters dated March 6, 2022, May 6, 2022, May 31, 2022, July 8, 2022 and July 10, 2022 along with numerous phone calls. However, despite our repeated requests, the company has not provided the requisite information for monitoring the ratings. In line with the extant Securities Board of Nepal (SEBON) guidelines, CRNL has reviewed the rating on the basis of the best available information which however, in CRNL's opinion is not sufficient to arrive at a fair rating. CRNL will monitor/watch the rating once for a minimum period of 6 months and notify the Securities Board of Nepal (SEBON) and public with regards to the withdrawal of rating. If after the monitoring of the rating there is no cooperation from the client, then after, CRNL may withdraw the rating.

The bank loan rating of HPPL will now be denoted as **CARE-NP BB-/ CARE-NP A4: ISSUER NOT COOPERATING*, (Notice of withdrawal)**.

Users of this rating (including investors, lenders and the public at large) are hence requested to exercise caution while using the above rating.

Detailed description of the key rating drivers

The long term rating has been revised by taking into account non-cooperation by HPPL with CARE's efforts to undertake a review of the rating outstanding. CARE views information availability risk as a key factor in its assessment of credit risk.

About the Company

HPPL is a public limited company, incorporated on July 7, 2013. The company is developing 27 MW run-of-river, Dordi Khola Hydropower Project (DKHP) in Lamjung district of Nepal. The project is constructed under BOOT (Build, Own, Operate and Transfer) mechanism. It is promoted by institutional as well as individual promoters. The company is listed in Nepal Stock Exchange. Ratio between promoter and public shareholders stands at 70:30 as on Mid-July, 2020.
